- Casa - House
- Agua - Water
- Comida - Food
- Amigo/Amiga - Friend
- Escuela - School
- Trabajo - Work

Try to use these words in simple sentences. For example, “Mi casa es grande” (My house is big) or “Tengo un amigo” (I have a friend).





SIMPLE CONVERSATION PRACTICE

- The best way to learn Spanish is by practicing simple conversations. Here is an example dialogue:
- Person A: Hola, ¿cómo estás?
- Person B: Bien, gracias. ¿Y tú?
- Person A: Estoy bien. ¿Cuál es tu nombre?
- Person B: Me llamo [Tu Nombre]. ¿Y tú?
- Person A: Me llamo [Tu Nombre]. Mucho gusto.
- Repeat this dialogue with a partner or record yourself. The more you practice, the easier it will be to speak Spanish.
